Beginning in seventh grade, students have the opportunity to begin earning college credit through the College Credit Plus program. In ninth grade, students additionally have the opportunity to choose from a variety of electives to enhance their high school experience and core subjects. Marion Prep students are regularly recognized for academic and personal achievements through the Star Mustang program which strives to build a positive culture that celebrates excellence. The school also offers free breakfast, lunch, and afterschool tutoring. Transportation may be provided for students residing within the Marion City School District.









# ACADEMIC PROGRESS
